Explanation of significant variances

Year ended 31st March 2019

Income

Two grants were received towards the purchase of a defibrillator for the Village Hall. These were £1,000 from Cumbria County Council and £2,000 from Groundwork/Tesco awarded from their blue token scheme. The defibrillator will be purchased in the 2020/21 financial year.

£260 was sent via BACS to the Parish Council's account from Allerdale Borough Council. This was for rental of the Village Hall for two elections in May and June. This money was sent to the account in error and ought to have been credited to the Village Hall's own bank account. (the money was subsequently handed over to the Village Hall Committee).

Expenditure

The 947.66 spent on the Village Hall comprised £687.66 paid to J Bowe for installation cost of new lighting, the light units themselves having been purchased in the previous financial year. This work utilised the remainder of a grant from the Cumbria Community Foundation to replace the existing lighting in the village hall with energy efficient lighting. £260 was paid to the Village Hall account as this had been erroneously credited via BACS to the Parish Council's account (see note under 'Income', above).
