38/15 Environment Agency – Flood Action Plan

Councillors heard a presentation by the Environment Agency on the requirements for setting up a flood action plan for the parish. Little Clifton is within the rapid response catchment category so the establishment of such a plan is deemed very important. Rebeccca Arkley is to write up the plan, for which she will require a lead contact plus two local volunteers to be local co-ordinators. Volunteers whose homes would not be at risk would be needed to help move furniture etc. when the water level starts to be dangerously high.

Parish councillors raised a number of concerns about drains which the Environment Agency staff will pass to Jonathan Coates for attention. David Snaith thought that the Environment Agency may be able to fund some water level gauge markers on either side of the ford where there were some historically. David Snaith also confirmed that the footbridge over the ford, which has a build up of debris beneath it, is on the Environment Agency's list of works to be carried out. Environment Agency may be able to provide a storage facility for sand bags.

The Chairman raised concern that planning applications do not appear to take account of possible flooding. David Snaith agreed to feed back the council's comments and concerns to Jonathan Coates for action.
